# NJ'S CLEAN ENERGY PROGRAM HELPS RESIDENTS SAVE ENERGY AND MONEY WITH ENERGY STAR QUALIFIED CLOTHES WASHER REBATE

(NEWARK, NJ) – With energy prices going up and winter quickly approaching, the New Jersey Board of Public Utilities (NJBPU) and New Jersey's **Clean Energy** Program<sup>TM</sup> are offering rebates of \$50 and \$75 on select ENERGY STAR® qualified clothes washers now through December 31, 2007. These washers will substantially reduce both energy and natural gas usage to help New Jersey residents save energy, money and the environment.

"New Jersey's **Clean Energy** Program is rewarding customers who use the most efficient ENERGY STAR qualified clothes washers," said NJBPU President Jeanne M. Fox. "On average, these washers use 53 percent less energy and 70 percent less water than a conventional model. It's one of many program offerings that help residents become a part of New Jersey's plan to use energy more wisely."

Consumers can get \$50 back from New Jersey's **Clean Energy** Program when they purchase eligible ENERGY STAR qualified clothes washers with a **Modified Energy Factor** (**MEF**) of **2.0-2.19** or \$75 back when they purchase ENERGY STAR qualified models with an **MEF** of **2.2** or higher.

The MEF is a measure of the energy consumption of the total laundry cycle and indicates how many cubic feet of laundry can be washed and dried with one kilowatt-hour of electricity; the higher the number, the better the efficiency.

Rebate applicants must be a customer of Atlantic City Electric, Jersey Central Power and Light, PSE&G Electric or Rockland Electric Company. Completed rebate forms must be postmarked no later than January 31, 2008, and must be accompanied by proof of purchase from a legible copy of a dated sales receipt.
