#### BY THE BOARD:

On June 16, 2016, Fern Murray ("Petitioner") filed a petition with the Board of Public Utilities ("Board") related to a billing dispute with Public Service Electric and Gas ("PSE&G" or "Respondent") for residential electric and gas service rendered by Respondent to the Petitioner.

After the filing of Respondent's answer, the Board transmitted this matter to the Office of Administrative Law ("OAL") for hearing and initial disposition as a contested case pursuant to N.J.S.A. 52:14B-1 et seq. and N.J.S.A. 52:14F-1 et seq. This matter was assigned to Administrative Law Judge ("ALJ") John P. Scollo.

The parties subsequently voluntarily agreed to resolve the matter and entered into a signed Stipulation of Dismissal with Prejudice ("Stipulation") that was submitted to the ALJ. By Initial Decision issued on February 21, 2017, and submitted to the Board on February 22, 2017 to which the Stipulation was attached and made part thereof, ALJ Scollo found that the Stipulation was voluntary, that its terms fully disposed of all issues in controversy and that it satisfied the requirements of N.J.A.C. 1:1-19.1.

Pursuant to the terms of the Stipulation and in order to fully resolve this matter, the parties agreed that \$2,163.68 is due and owing on Petitioner's account. Respondent has agreed to credit \$756.00 to Petitioner, thereby reducing the balance to \$1,407.68. After application of the credit. Petitioner has agreed to pay the remaining balance.

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After review of the Initial Decision and the Stipulation, the Board <u>HEREBY FINDS</u> that the parties have voluntarily agreed to the settlement as evidenced by their signatures and that, by the terms of the Stipulation, they have fully resolved all outstanding contested issues in this matter. Accordingly, the Board <u>HEREBY ADOPTS</u> the Initial Decision and the Stipulation executed by the parties in their entirety as if fully set forth herein.

The effective date of this Order is April 3, 2017.

This matter was filed on September 22, 2016 with the Office of Administrative Coadriec Law (OAL) for hearing as a contested case pursuant to N.J.S.A. 52:14B-1 to -15 and N.J.S.A. 52:14F1 to -13. Several telephone conferences were held wherein the parties advised the undersigned that they were working towards an amicable resolution of the within matter. On January 5, 2017, the parties advised the Court that the matter was settled and requested additional time to draft and fully execute the Settlement Agreement. On February 13, 2017, the undersigned received the Settlement

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Agreement and Release indicating the terms of settlement and is attached hereto and made a part hereof:

I have reviewed the record and terms of the settlement and FIND:

- 1. The parties have voluntarily agreed to the resolution of the within matter as evidenced by their signatures or the signatures of their representatives.
- 2. The Settlement fully disposes of all issues in controversy and is consistent with the law.

Therefore, I CONCLUDE that this Stipulation of Settlement meets the requirements of N.J.A.C. 1:1-19.1 and that the settlement should be approved. Accordingly, it is ORDERED that the parties comply with the terms, and it is FURTHER ORDERED that the proceedings in this matter be concluded.

I hereby FILE my initial decision with the BOARD OF PUBLIC UTILITIES for consideration.

This recommended decision may be adopted, modified or rejected by the BOARD OF PUBLIC UTILITIES, which by law is authorized to make a final decision in this matter. If the Board of Public Utilities does not adopt, modify or reject this decision within forty-five days and unless such time limit is otherwise extended, this recommended decision shall become a final decision in accordance with N.J.S.A. - 52:14B-10.

On or about June 16, 2016, Petitioner filed a petition in the above-referenced billing dispute.

In the interests of resolving this matter without further delay, extensive effort, and costs, Petitioner and PSE&G agree to settle this matter on the following terms:

- The Petition is amended to include all charges through January 17<sup>th</sup>, 2017.
- 2) The parties agree that \$2,163.68 is due and owing on Petitioner's account as of January 5, 2017.
- 3) PSE&G shall issue a one-time credit of \$756 to Petitioner's account ending in 69409 to settle this matter.
- 4) Petitioner hereby enters into a 20-month deferred payment arrangement (DPA) on the remaining outstanding balance of \$1,407.68.
- 5) Petitioner's payments under the DPA start with the January 17, 2017 billing. Petitioner shall pay her monthly charges plus \$71 (DPA), for 19 consecutive months, due on company records by the 10th of each month.
- 6) For the twentieth consecutive monthly payment, petitioner shall pay current monthly charges plus \$58.68 to fulfill the DPA.
- 7) If the DPA is broken, PSE&G can proceed with regular collection activity as noted in New Jersey Administrative Code N.J.A.C. 14:3-7.7.
- 8. This Agreement resolves and settles the dispute captioned above; Respondent and Petitioner agree that no claims or grievances can be later adjudicated relating thereto.

9. The undersigned agree that this Settlement contains mutually balancing and interdependent provisions and is intended to be accepted and approved in its entirety.
