BACKGROUND:

On April 9, 2020, Princeton University ("Princeton") filed a petition with the New Jersey Board of Public Utilities ("Board") seeking a waiver of Board jurisdiction pursuant to N.J.S.A. 48:2-13 to permit electrical sub-metering of facilities to be constructed on the Lake Campus and potentially the proposed geoexchange system for the heating and chilling of water. Princeton also seeks a waiver from Public Service Electric and Gas Company's ("PSE&G's") utility tariff prohibiting sub-metering.

In the petition, Princeton provides that it is in the process of constructing a new substation that it will own and operate on its Lake Campus located south of Lake Carnegie. Princeton is considering several different scenarios to effectuate providing power, and possibly the geoexchange of heated and chilled water, from the substation to a number of facilities to be constructed on the Lake Campus, including facilities owned and operated by Princeton and potentially facilities owned and operated by third parties.

Princeton is designing and building a central geoexchange plant to supply hot and chilled water to each new Lake Campus building. Princeton proposes to submeter the graduate housing apartments. Princeton asserts that when powered by renewable electricity, the Lake Campus will have negligible fossil fuel use and carbon emissions. Princeton has contemplated three (3) scenarios to provide electricity to the Lake Campus.

In the petition, Princeton asserts that, absent the issuance of a waiver, the contemplated three scenarios would place Princeton in a position of being considered a "utility" or "regulated entity"

by the Board and would subject Princeton to full Board jurisdiction. Therefore, Princeton asserts that a waiver of the Board's regulations and PSE&G's tariff is necessary because otherwise, they would present a substantial hardship to Princeton and its operations.

DISCUSSION AND FINDINGS

The Board has determined that the petition should be retained by the Board for hearing pursuant to N.J.S.A. 48:2-32. The Board <u>HEREBY</u> <u>DESIGNATES</u> Commissioner Mary-Anna Holden as the presiding officer. The Board <u>FURTHER</u> <u>ORDERS</u> that Commissioner Mary-Anna Holden, as the presiding Commissioner, is <u>HEREBY</u> <u>AUTHORIZED</u> to establish and modify schedules, decide all motions, and otherwise control the conduct of this case, without the need for full Board approval, subject to subsequent Board ratification.

The Board <u>HEREBY</u> <u>DIRECTS</u> that all entities seeking to intervene or participate in this matter file the appropriate application with the Board by August 19, 2020. Commissioner Mary-Anna Holden will render a decision on any motions filed. Any party wishing to file a motion for admission of counsel, <u>pro hac vice</u>, should do so concurrently with any motion to intervene or participate.

In addition, in compliance with the Board's Order in Docket No. EO20030254,¹ all parties are <u>HEREBY DIRECTED</u> to serve all documents electronically. No hard copies shall be filed until the Board lifts the restrictions imposed in that Order. The Board <u>HEREBY DIRECTS</u> Staff to post this Order to the Board's website.
